

Curriculum Features:

- Perry High School does not implement class rank.
- 2023-2024 Advanced Placement classes are available in English Language, English Literature, American Government, U.S. History, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Art, and Spanish, as well as several Online courses. Availability of these classes are dependent on student requests.
- Honors level courses are available in American History, Modern World History, American Government, English 9-12, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Geometry, Algebra I, Algebra 2, Trigonometry, Applied Calculus, and Spanish IV.
- In 2023, 75 students completed 121 Advanced Placement exams.
- GPA is computed using final grades of all courses for all students, except Cognitively Delayed.
- College Credit Plus (CCP) courses are posted on the Perry transcript and are labeled with the campus where the credit was earned. The most common campuses attended by Perry Students are Lakeland Community College, Lake Erie College, and Kent State University – Ashtabula.
- Work based internships and online classes are available at Perry High School.
- **Perry Service Learning** (PSL) is an interdisciplinary elective for seniors that combines English and Social Studies curricula with meaningful hands-on service at a community agency. Unlike traditional community service programs and service clubs that focus on charitable acts to address problems, PSL strives to help students develop democratic values by working for justice, becoming advocates, and affecting change. The course was carefully designed based on how students learn, how they think, the nature of experience, and how to educate students for active participation in democratic life.

- Online Health is offered as a credit advancement opportunity in the summer.

Standards-based Learning Environment: Perry High School has adopted a Standards-based Learning Environment. This means that grading and reporting practices are more compatible with an emphasis on learning, not just point accumulation. Grades are an accurate reflection of what the student has learned about the content and are supportive of learning because the student readily knows specific areas of strength and weakness. Classroom assessments serve as meaningful sources of information. They are well aligned to clearly stated learning targets based on the Ohio Academic Content Standards and are extensions of the teacher's instructional strategies. The criteria for grading are clear so the student knows what the teacher will accept as evidence that learning has occurred; attitude, effort and behavior are reported separately.
